The resort has a low-waste policy, which is also what enabled them to be a partner of the project's Campaign to Phase Out Single-Use Plastics in the Hospitality Sector.




IMPACT OF SUSTAINABLE OPERATIONS

Key Actions

Food purchases and grid electricity are the highest contributors to the property's emissions. For grid electricity, the property:

- **Trained employees** in energy reduction measures such as turning off lights when not in use
- Gave friendly reminders to guests about the use of electricity
- Used green technology products such as more energy-efficient lightemitting diode (LED) light bulbs.

Key Challenges

Staff may require additional skills or training to perform successfully. Budgetary restrictions are also among the challenges the property faces in reducing GHG emissions.

WATER CONSUMPTION


Progress/Impact made today

Key Actions

- Towel and linen reuse schemes (towels and bed linen are replaced on guest's demand and not every day)
- Recycling water for grass and plant **irrigation** through Sewage Treatment Plant.
- Using Waterless No-Flush™ urinals that offer zero water consumption.
- Using **self-closing water saving taps** with auto off function that controls water stream which limits the water use

Key Challenges

Cost constraints for more costly and technically sophisticated measures; and lack of awareness among employees and guests about the importance of conserving water and their potential impact on hotels in the future are among the challenges to conserve water consumption.

Key Actions

- Food waste **segregation**
- Collection of organic kitchen separately for composting

Key Challenges

Among the difficulties the property finds to reduce food waste is human error brought on by **inadequate planning** and kitchen staff who are **unaware** of the widespread problem.

Key Actions

- Using stainless steel or paper straws at The Village Restaurant
- Using brown bags, biodegradable take-out boxes, paper cups and paper straws for take-out orders
- Refillable dispensers for organic conditioning shampoo and biodegradable packaging for organic bar soaps as part of room amenities
- Glass bottles in rooms can be refilled from water dispensers on each floor

Key Challenges

Due to the **pandemic**, the resort has been challenged to maintain these plastic-free initiatives. Due to **current health protocols** and for the safety of guests and staff, glass bottles and public water dispensers have been temporarily removed.



OTHER SUSTAINABILITY EFFORTS



Opt for products that are **recyclable**



Engage with suppliers that have social and environmental policies



Choose items with long warranties and with low operating, maintenance and consumable costs and avoid products with hazardous and toxic materials.



LOOKING INTO THE FUTURE

The resort is in the process of establishing a **sewage treatment plant** for their use and to conserve water. On energy efficiency, the property is also looking to install **solar panels**. On reducing waste, the property will continue to use biodegradable materials for their packaging.

Having information on environmental issues is not enough if societies fail to addressed the global issues. Individuals concerned about human impacts on the global environmental systems that sustain must work steadily and continue to promote sustainable practices while constructively contributing to both the economy and the environment.
